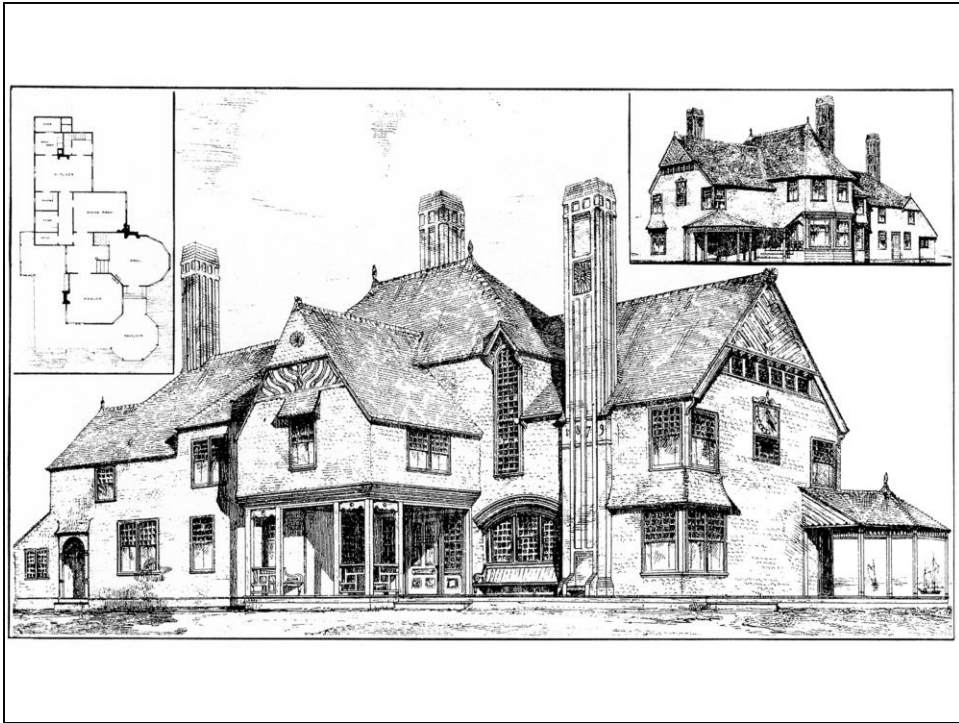




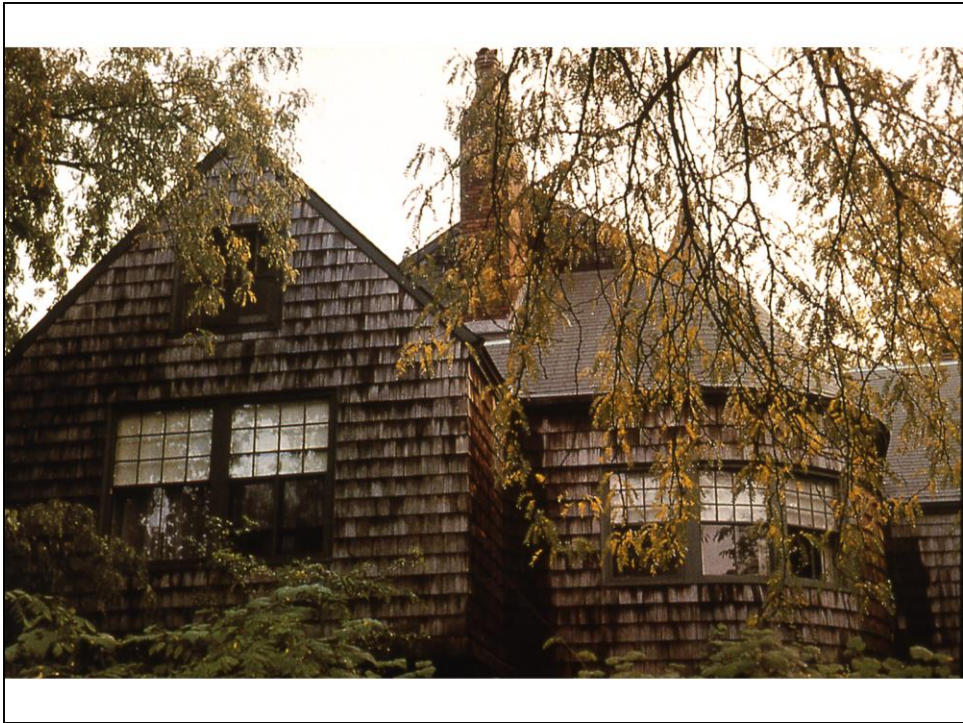

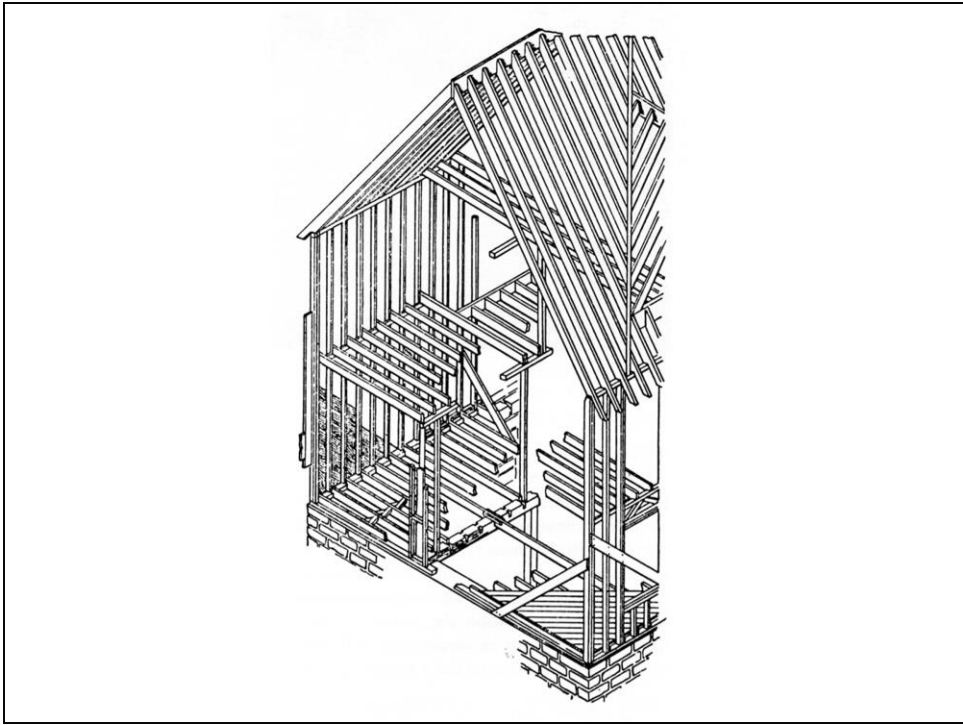
W.R. Emerson, Casa a Mount Desert, Main (1879)



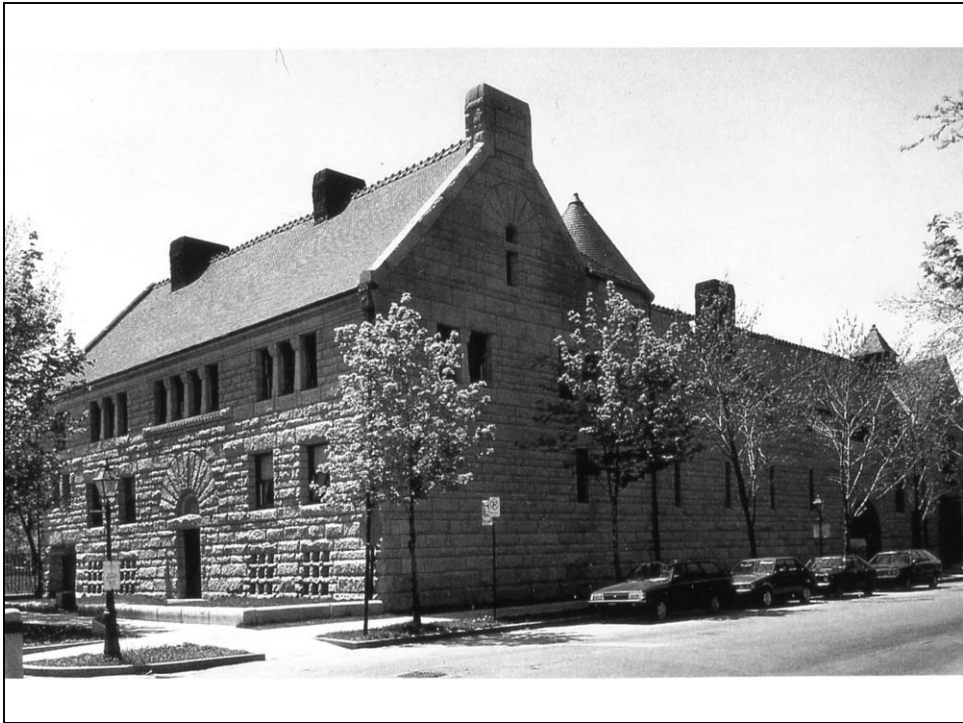
H.H. Richardson, Stoughton House, Cambridge, Mass., 1882-83



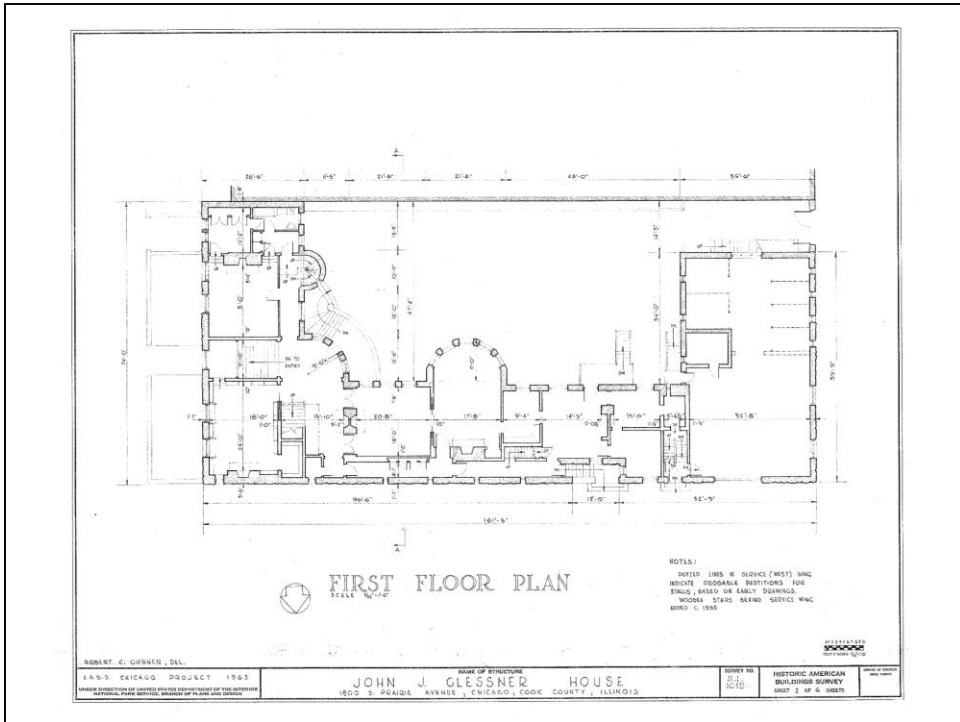

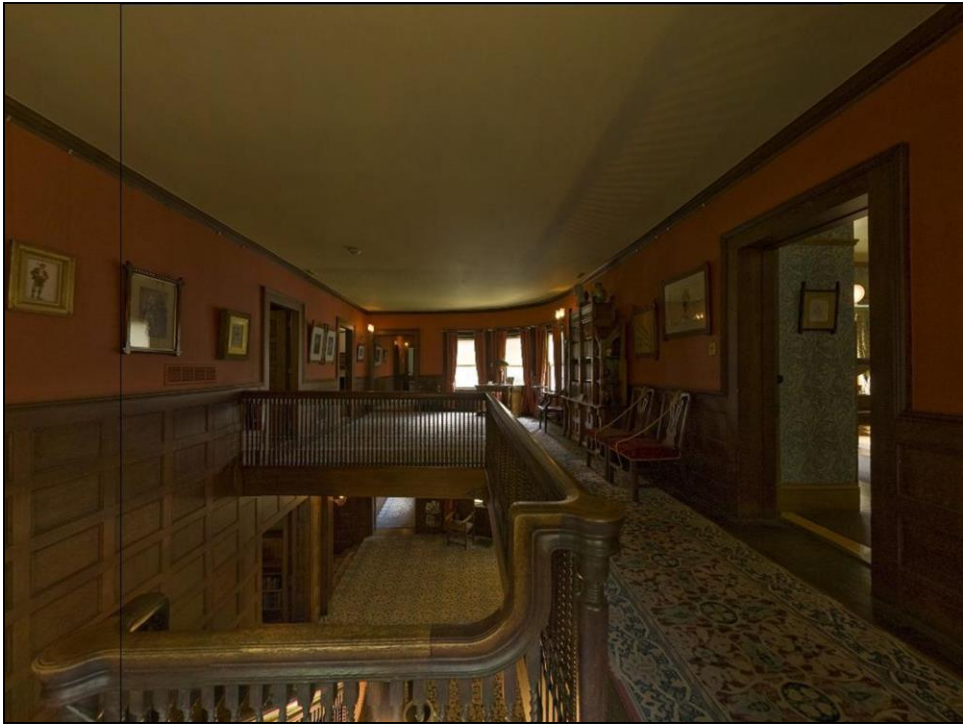

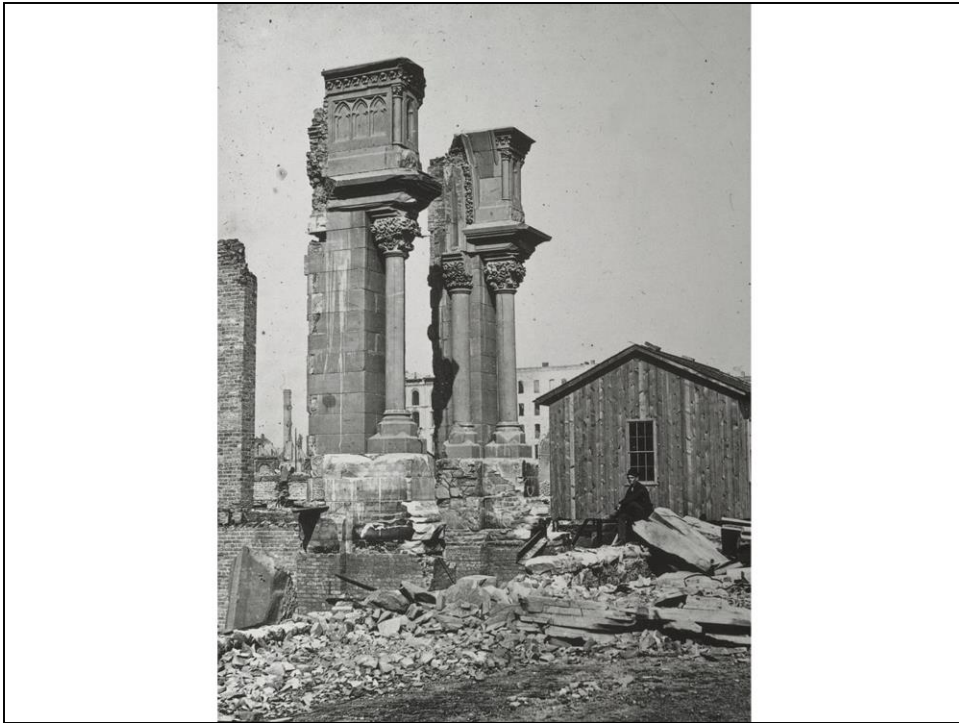

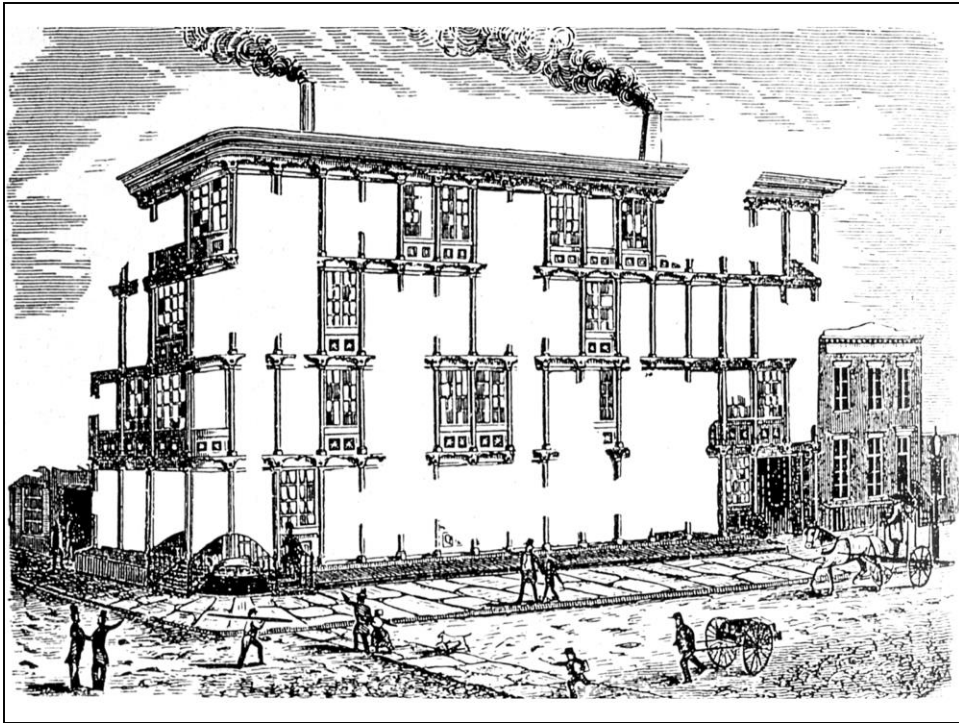


Chicago dopo l'incendio, 1871 ca.

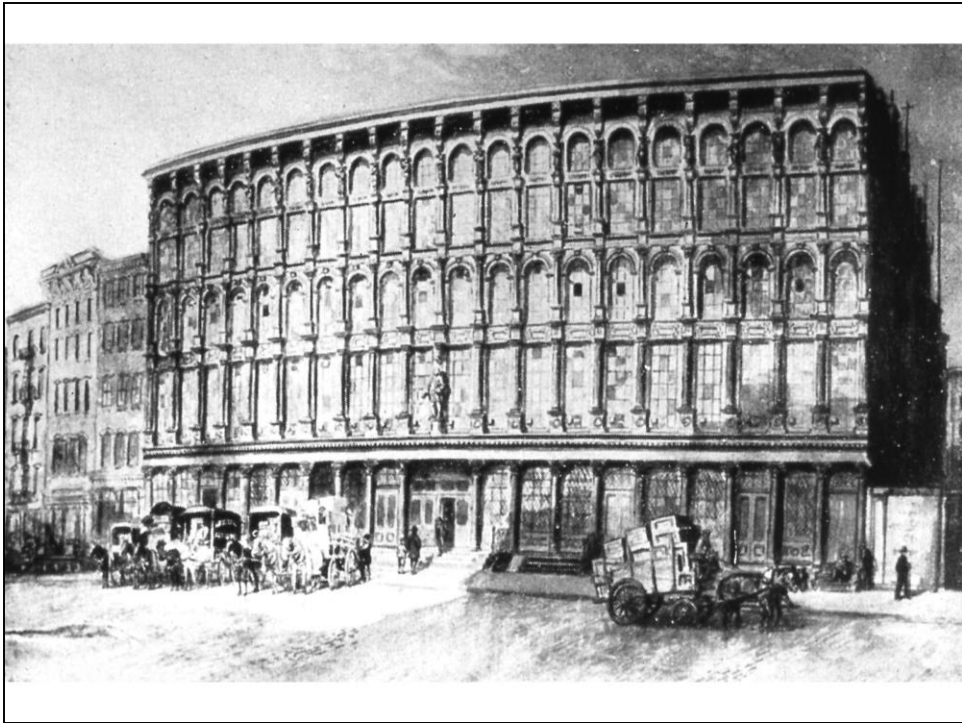

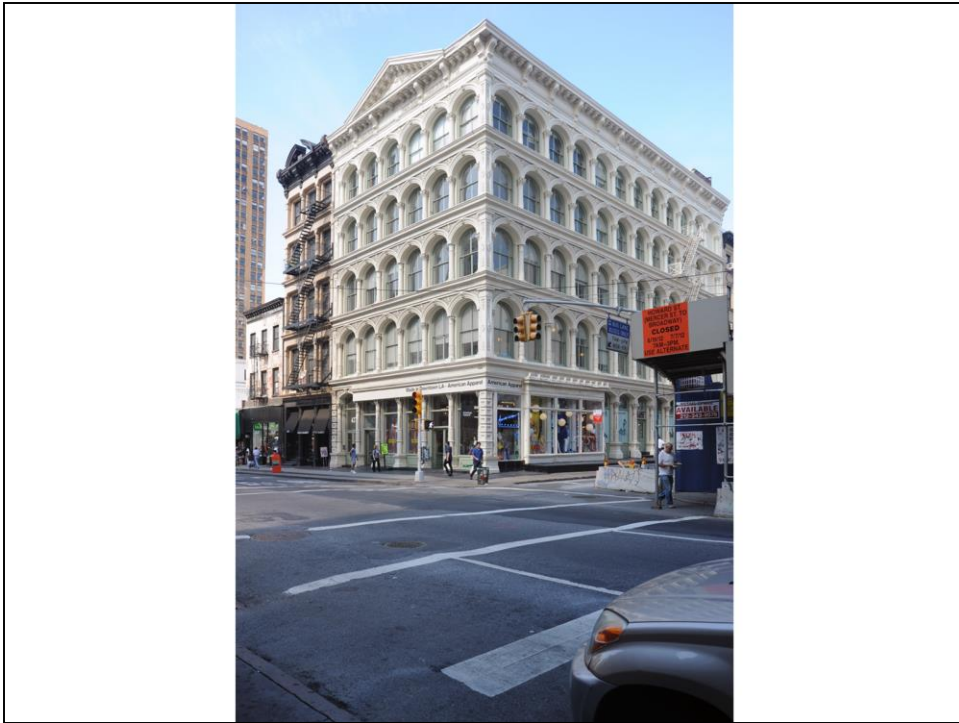


Edificio ideale in ghisa, da J. Bogardus, *Cast Iron Buildings, their Construction and Advantages*, 1858

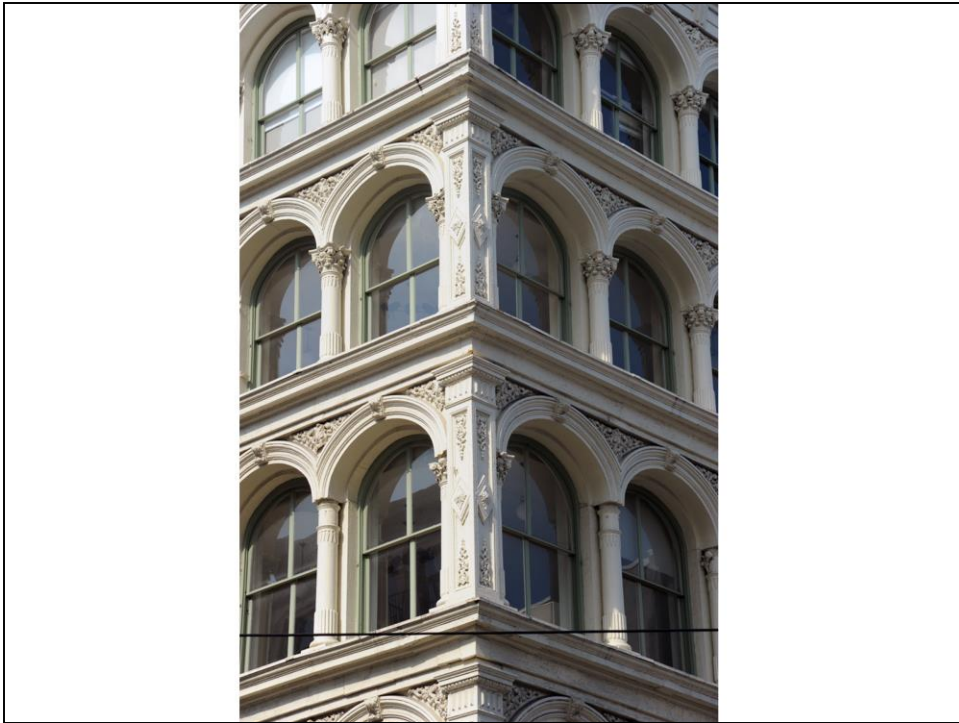

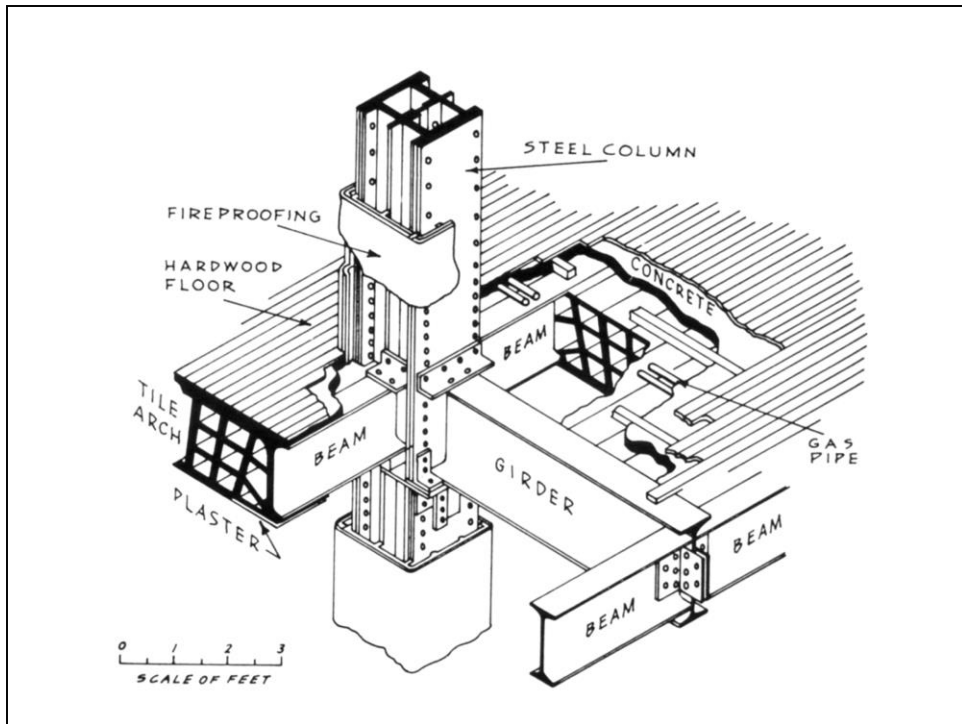




Edificio in ghisa a Soho, New York, seconda metà del XIX secolo

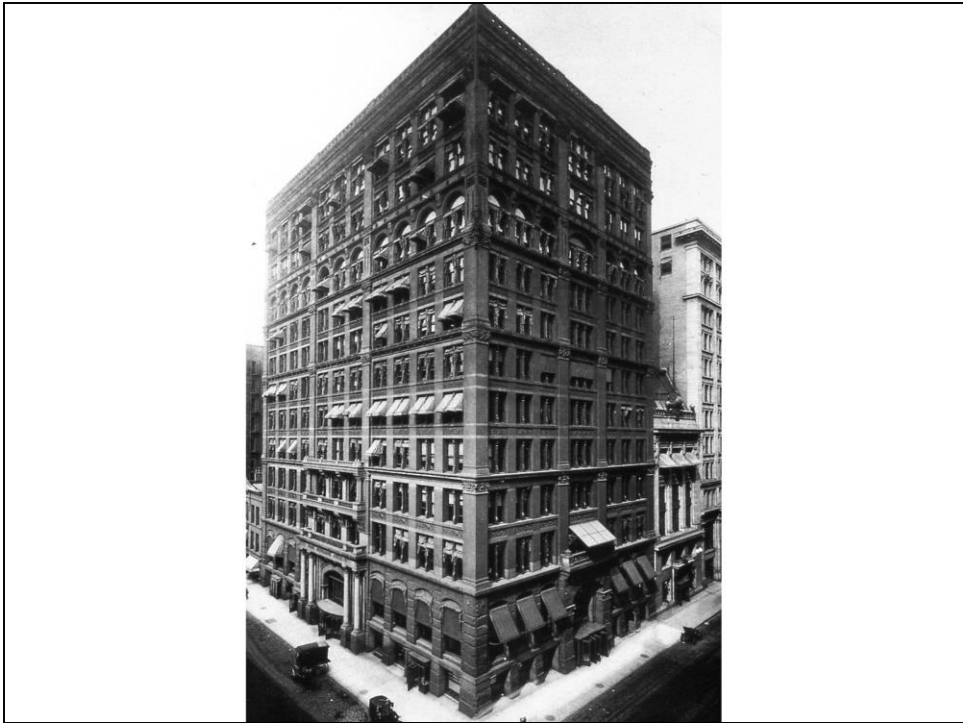

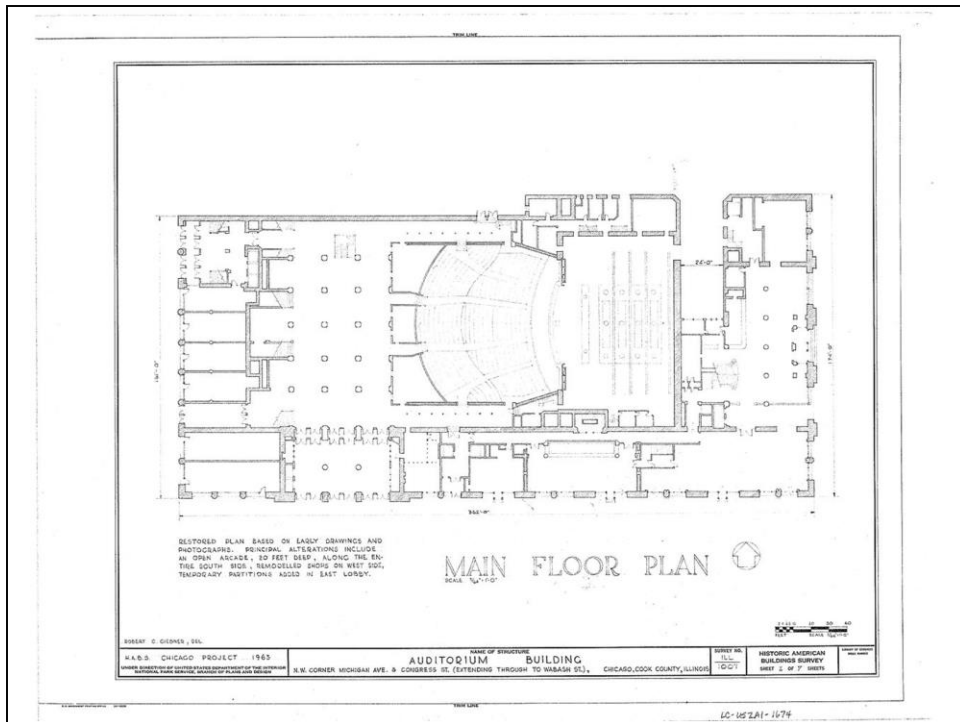

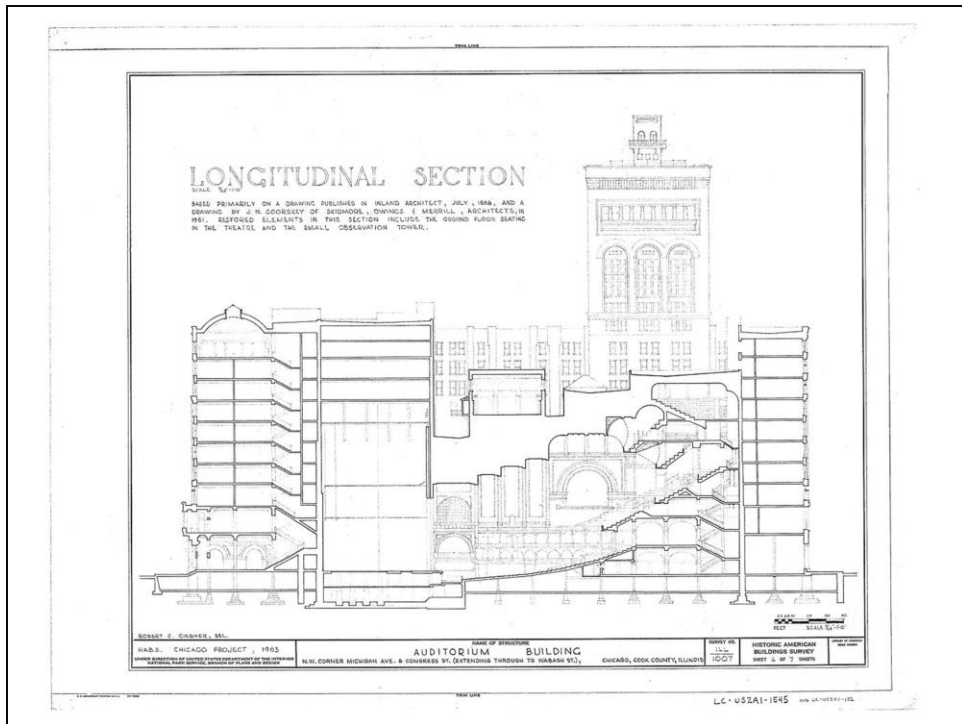

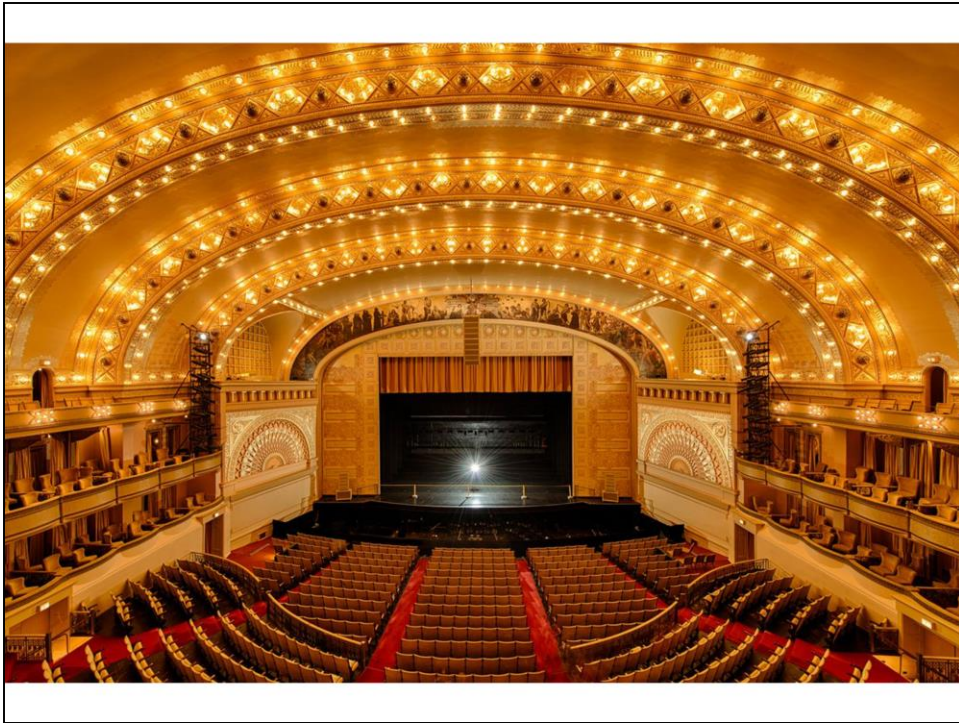

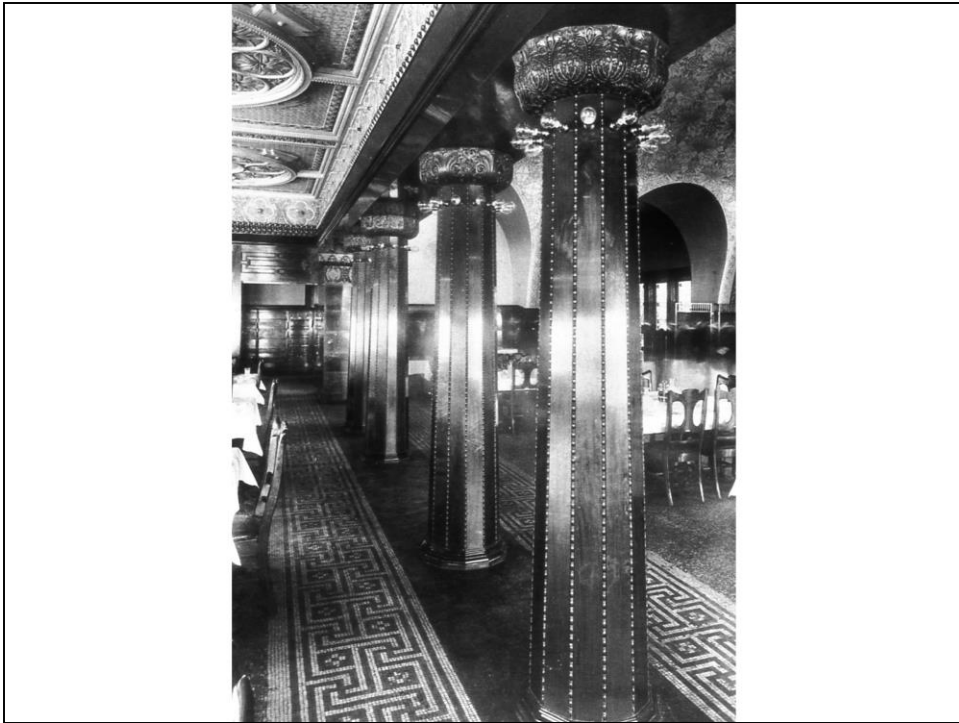
L. Sullivan e D. Adler, Auditorium Building, Chicago (1886-89): pianta del piano terreno

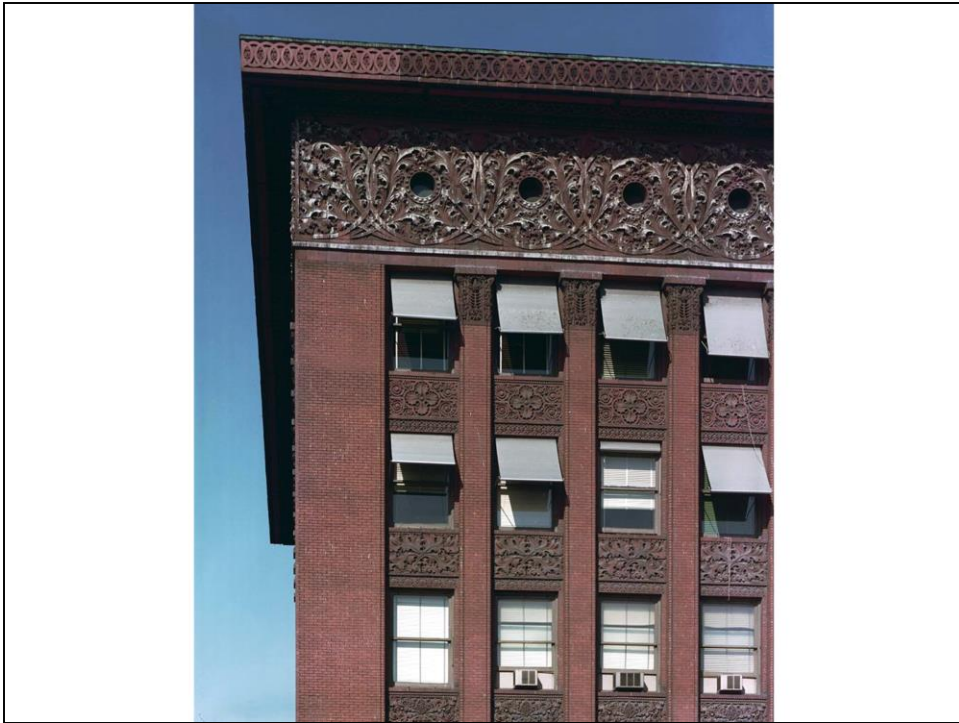

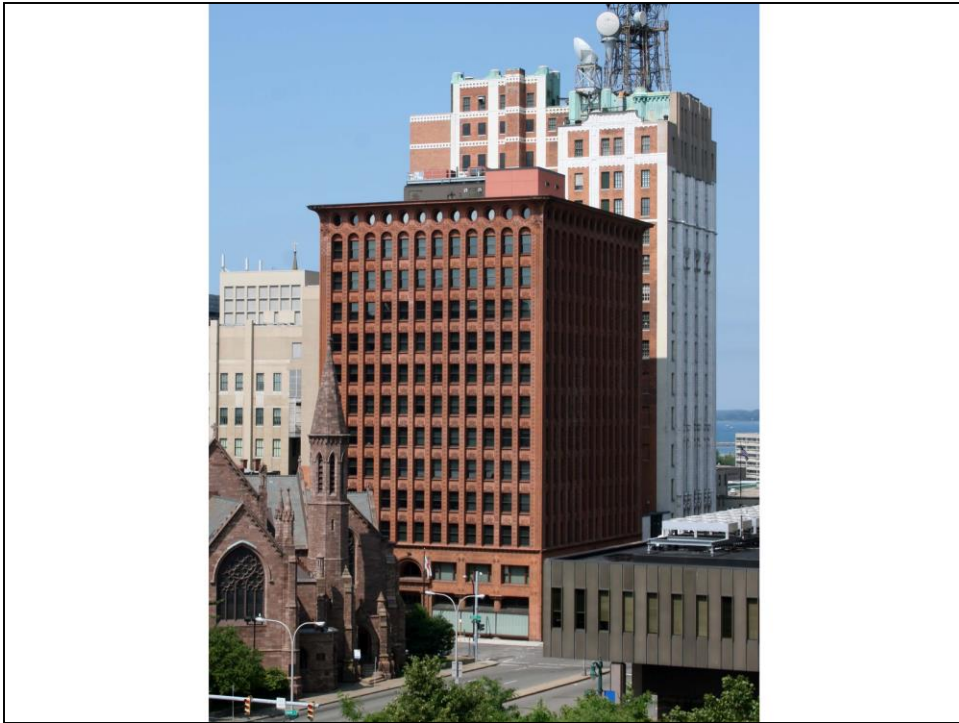
